#### Evaluation (Doc 3a)

- 2. Comments:
- Obj 1: Observe the institutions that support consuming minors. Very good, because we stayed with the "Youth Project" 2 afternoons spent in the NGO. They explained the program and have allowed us to attend different groups with parents and youngsters, a personal interview with a family from the "tailored program" and a new application individual interview. It was really interesting and really what we wanted to see! In addition, we spent a morning in a closed center that hosts minors under judicial measures related to consumption. It was impressive, even if it does not serve us really for the future.
- Objective 2: Understanding how these institutions work with families. Very good ! 50% of the work is done with the youngsters, 50% with their parents (or guardians). They engage together in therapy. They mark this commitment by signing an agreement then they have to participate in groups and parents' school.
- Goal 3: See how these institutions work in the non-family environment. Low, because we
  have seen nothing. At the same time, I do not think they really work with the extra-family
  environment. We only know that they contact the school and the attending physician or
  other if necessary.

#### 3. Have you had more than your initial objectives?

Yes. "Youth Project" works with shift schedule (16h-21h), therefore we could visit other services of the NGOs: the visitor center, therapeutic communities (open and closed) and incarcerated juvenile facility. It was very interesting also because our organization offers similar services. We will feedback to the whole team to inform them of what we have seen in these services. This may be useful.

5. Are you considering concrete follow-up after this exchange? This trip gave us lots of ideas. We planned several team meetings to discuss good practices and see what we can transpose to our working model.

6. Overall Rating: 4 = Good

In each service, with each interviewee (staff or beneficiary), we received a super warm welcome. It was really great! It seemed that there were not really established schedule and the staffs were warned of our arrival at the last moment, but that did not prevent the progress of the stay. These were two super intense days, rich in information and emotions. The bonus of this trip was to reside with 2 beneficiaries. By doing so, we were in total immersion. The host NGO was very generous: they picked us up and drove us to the airport, they offered meals and accommodation and we did not have to worry about anything, just follow. I went there as a translator. I admit that it was stressing me out a little before the start because I am not a perfect bilingual; I only have a little experience of three months in Peru where the accent is very different from that of the host country but everything went well! They were attentive to talk to me more slowly and really put me at ease. In the end, there were no communication problems.

# strong ideas (Doc 3b)

1. "If the family does not change, the youngster will not change!" = Currency P ... S ... This means that 50% of the work is done with the parents and 50% with the young person. It is announced from the start, the whole family is committed in therapy. The therapeutic contract = the symbol of this commitment.

2. 3 rules (3 conditions) to integrate the program - NO drugs - NO violence - NO loneliness + the therapeutic contract still symbolizing the commitment: the young person agrees to comply with the 3 rules, the parents commit to support him and all agree to come to the groups.

3. The program is divided into four phases and each phase has a specific purpose (the rules, attitudes, emotions, closure).

4. The young person and his parents really evolve in peer group and there is a therapeutic referent per phase.

What to do? (To remember after my return)

5. Send the money back and send the proof of expenditure to Ecett

6. Make a PowerPoint to present what we saw in the team

#### Feedbacks

- 12. The coordinator: she considers the basic premise (if the family does not change, the young will not change) to be an essential basis for work with families at home.
- 13. Family therapist: everything is played in the alliance phase, the aim is not to blame the parents but rather to make them aware that we need them to get there, to support the young person and aim the abandonment of consumption. The resources are not only professional, family resources are also important.
- 14. The director: has the impression that the parents are not ready to hear that they have to change. The message should be passed differently: if they want to change the situation, they will have to invest themselves in the therapy, so be aware that they will have to come here once a week for example.
- 15. The psychologist: all that (work only in peer group; tell the family that if they do not change, the young person will not change ...) it works in Spain, but it would be difficult to apply these methods in our country because we do not have the same culture. We are closer to the Anglo-Saxon model than to the Latin one and it is necessary to continue the work individually. Given the economic climate in Spain, he is surprised to learn that the services are not free at the host institution and that it is expensive (200€/month).
- 16. Trainee A ... K ...: Note that the NGO P ... S ... is not as strongly supported as us by the region or state. Basically it's free. Initially, they gave a box to each group and everyone put what he/she wanted. They noticed that everyone took an average 200€ per month, therefore they ask it from the beginning. However, this should not be a hindrance. Families give what they can (one gave € 75).
- **17.** Trainee T ... P ...: young people contest the authority (including us) but not the peer group. Ditto for the parents. This is why the groups are super interesting.
